Arnie Suntag is the president and founder of *Walk of Faith*, previously known as *Rational Christian Ministries*. The ministry conducts seminars and educational series on health and disease prevention and provides outreach services to the community.

A former executive, Arnie left the corporate world after 28 years to preach the Gospel. Diagnosed with serious medical challenges including cancer and degenerative spinal disease, he persevered through prayer and alternative medicine, offering hope to those facing similar challenges. During that

time, he narrowly averted a meeting at the World Trade Center on the morning of the September 11 tragedy. He was later exposed to SARS on a visit to China. After returning to the United States, his home was threatened by the widely publicized forest fires in northern Arizona. His unyielding faith through these trials led him to write *The Rational Christian* - a controversial book about church history, available at Amazon.com and other retailers. He is also a contributing author for *Extraordinary Miracles in the Lives of Ordinary People* – a sequel to the best-selling book *Miracles Still Happen*. He has appeared on television programs such as *Praise the Lord* (TBN), *Helpline* (CBS), and on QVTV (Quo Vadis Ministry) – a new channel from the founders of Amazing Discoveries with Walter Veith. He has also been a guest on numerous radio programs. Those who are faced with adversity are encouraged that by having a true faith in God, even the most difficult trials can be overcome. Arnie is also a songwriter. In 2008 he released the album *He is Here* with arrangements by Michael Andrews, the composer-arranger for *It Is Written* - the acclaimed television series on Bible truths. He has also produced and directed a number of documentary films.

Arnie grew up in a Jewish family in Brooklyn, New York. He has been recognized for spearheading some of the earliest anti-smoking legislation in Arizona and for developing a prototype of the electronic bill-paying systems now in use by major banks worldwide. He has been an advocate for victims of domestic violence and child abuse, has served on numerous public organizations including the Arizona State Foster Care Review Board, and has been a foster parent. Today, Arnie and his wife Susan are intricately involved in education and community outreach within the Seventh-day Adventist Church.
