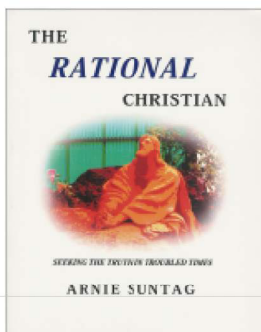

Arnie Suntag is the president and founder of Walk of Faith, previously known as Rational Christian Ministries. The ministry offers seminars on health and prevention, drug and alcohol abuse counseling, and services to the indigent. Arnie left his position as a corporate executive after 28 years to preach the Gospel. His testimony has been an inspiration to many. Diagnosed with serious medical problems including a degenerative spinal disease, he overcame his challenges through prayer and natural healing. During his struggle, he narrowly averted a meeting at the World Trade Center on the morning of the September 11 tragedy and was later exposed to SARS on a visit to China. After returning to the United States, his home was nearly destroyed by forest fires in northern Arizona. His unyielding faith through these trials led him to write *The Rational Christian*, a controversial book on the last days and church history. During the writing of the book, medical complications presented him with the daily challenge of staying alive to complete the work. Today, Arnie evangelizes at churches throughout the nation. He has appeared on television programs such as *Praise the Lord* (Trinity Broadcasting Network) and *Helpline* (CBS Studios). Those who are faced with adversity are encouraged that by trusting in God, even the most difficult trials can be overcome. Arnie also writes Christian music. In 2008 he released the album *He is Here*, with arrangements by Michael Andrews - the composer-arranger for the television series, *It Is Written*. Arnie was born in New York and raised Jewish. He attended the State University of New York at Oswego, where he majored in Biology and Psychology. He has been recognized for spearheading the earliest anti-smoking legislation in Arizona and for developing a prototype of the electronic bill paying systems now in use by major banks worldwide. He is an advocate for victims of domestic violence, has served on numerous public organizations including the Arizona State Foster Care Review Board, and has been a foster parent. He and his wife Susan live in Tucson where they continue to work in education, disease prevention, and evangelism.
